

**DIVISION J - POSTER ART**

1. Posters must be designed on or affixed to standard poster board 14"x 22" dimensions. Any medium may be used.
2. Well known (copyrighted) cartoon figures such as Snoopy, Garfield, Charlie Brown, Annie, etc. may not be used.
3. Name and address along with a brief interpretive statement should be clearly written on back in the upper left-hand corner.

1. Unless otherwise indicated, note whether entry is a kit or not a kit.

**DIVISION L – COLLECTIONS & SCRAPBOOKS**

Collection must consist of at least 5 items and not more than 25 items unless suitably framed (frame or case cannot be larger than 36 x 36 inches). The total area of each collection not to exceed 36 x 36 inches. In Class 732, fifteen (15) or more are needed. All entries in NAME of collector and give evidence of added item from previous year.

- 729 - Stamps in book or framed - United States  
 730 - Stamps in book or framed - Topical (any one topic)  
 731 - Stamps in book or framed – Foreign  
 732 - Arrowhead collection 15 or more different specimens displayed in box or framed  
 733 - Coins in book or framed - United States  
 734 - Coins in a book or framed – Foreign  
 735 - Miniatures, (5 or more) under 4 inches: horses, dogs, cats, cars, wild animals, dolls, tins, metals, china and thimbles, etc.  
 736 - Stuffed Animals (all one type) collection (example dogs)  
 737 - Stuffed Animals collection of different animals  
 738 - Animals one type (example: all horses, all ducks, etc.) not stuffed (example: plastic, wood, glass)

**DIVISION M- VEGETABLES AND GARDENING**

1. All exhibits must be grown and exhibited by the exhibitor.
2. Each entry must be on a disposable white paper plate adequate in size for entry.
3. Entries will be accepted only if listed number of vegetables are displayed, example (Beets, 5 topped).
4. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per class.
5. Classes will be judged in five age divisions: Junior 4- H, Intermediate 4- H, Senior 4-H, Open Youth and Open Adult
